This is a very cozy, warm house and a great place to raise a family. As for architectural details, the kitchen cabinets were designed and built by Kennebec Kitchen Designs of Bath, Maine, the original cabinet maker for This Old house. The master bedroom suite features a spacious bedroom, two walk-in closets, cedar closet, and a large bathroom with over-sized shower, soaking tub, and matching sinks. The lower level offers ample space for future expansion. The west-facing rear of the house offers spectacular sunsets and the screened-in porch is great spot for summertime dinners and lazy Sunday mornings.

This home is located less than a ten-minute walk to Lincoln Elementary School, McCall Middle School, library, Town Hall, post office, town center and the commuter rail station and, yes, people actually do walk to the station.

The second floor office (with built-in workstation) that abuts the Master Bedroom suite is a comfortable space to work from home or take care of projects and housekeeping.
